I had some questions from a member on scoring in Golf Genius (GG) a tournament or two ago. I'm sure others might have the same questions, so here is a quick GG note. When you are playing a NIMAGA Tournament, someone in each group needs to enter scores into the Golf Genius app (search for Golf Genius on your mobile device and download). If you haven't done it yet, it's simple and everyone should take a turn. It makes it much easier for the tournament directors doing scoring at the end of the round. Occasionally, we must move players around on the day of a tournament, due to a no show or someone running late. If that happens, you can still enter scores into GG. The person who switches groups can put his own score into the app and leave the rest blank from his original group. Someone from his original group can enter the rest of the group's scores and leave his blank. That way all scores are entered and scoring afterwards is much easier.

IN MEMORIAM - ROGER SCOTT

NIMAGA is sad to report the loss of one of our own. Roger Scott passed away on July 4, 2025.

Roger has a long and storied history with Illinois golf and the NIMAGA organization. NIMAGA was founded in 1960, and Roger joined in 1973 and has been a member ever since. From the onset, Roger took an active role in NIMAGA and became a director shortly thereafter. He rose through the ranks in NIMAGA, eventually serving as President in 1998.

Roger worked constantly supporting golf in Illinois and promoting the NIMAGA organization. From his email id (nimagarog.xxxxx) to his personalized license plates (NIMAGA1), Roger was a key figure in promoting and growing the organization from the mid-1970s and on. During that period, our membership grew to its largest numbers, over 400 players. Roger and his fellow board members were instrumental in shaping NIMAGA into the organization much like it exists today.

Roger also spread his golf knowledge beyond NIMAGA, serving as a marshal and rules official in numerous tournaments throughout the Chicagoland area and abroad. He gave many of his hours to the Northwestern Women's golf team as well as to the Illinois Woman's Open. He was a member at Cruden Bay Golf Club in Scotland and volunteered his time and expertise to many tournaments in that area. Many of his fellow NIMAGA members have joined him on golf trips abroad.

After Roger left the NIMAGA board, he stayed on as a member and was named as an honorary board member.

Roger is survived by his wife, Barbara.

RIP Roger and thanks for all your years of service to NIMAGA.

2025 NIMAGA MEMBERSHIP REGISTRATION

TOURNAMENT SIGN-UP

We have had great participation in our tournaments for 2025. Just a reminder to enter those tournaments as early as you can to avoid being placed on a waitlist. When our field is full, we will work with the golf course to see if more tee times are available.

So far, we have been successful in getting more tournament spots, but this is never guaranteed. So, register early.

NIMAGA PLAYER OF THE YEAR POINTS

Starting with the 2025 season, NIMAGA Cup Points will be displayed in Golf Genius under one heading (NIMAGA Player of the Year points). Points totals will no longer be displayed under playing divisions as in prior years.

The NIMAGA Board will be adjusting the method of choosing the NIMAGA Cup teams for the 2026 season. The rules for the 2026 NIMAGA Cup tournament will be communicated prior to the 2026 NIMAGA Cup tournament.

The NIMAGA Cup teams for the 2025 tournament are already determined based on last year's NIMAGA Cup points finishing totals. You would receive an invitation to that tournament if you finished in the top 12 of your playing division.

RULES SECTION

Playing the Wrong Tees and Definition of a Stroke

This will be another brief article to clarify a few issues that came up in my group in the Summer Classic at Prairie Isle. These are a couple of basic rules, but we have a lot of new members that may not have played strictly by the Rules of Golf in the past and might not have applied these rules in their prior casual rounds. And our seasoned members may also need a refresher. By the way, welcome to all our new members. Feel free to reach out if you have any rules questions.

Playing the Wrong Tees

Now that NIMAGA is playing all our tournaments with the "Choose Your Tee" option, it is important to make sure you pay attention to the appropriate tee that you have chosen and play from the correct box on every hole throughout your round.

Unfortunately, I personally got penalized by this rule at the Summer Classic. There was some confusion for our foursome on the first tee, and I initially played from the wrong tee box.

The rules regarding the tee box are part of **Rule 6 – Playing a Hole.**

The <u>teeing area</u> is defined as a rectangle that is *two club-lengths deep* where:

- The front edge is defined by the line between the forward-most points of two tee-markers set by the Committee, and
- The side edges are defined by the lines back from the outside points of the teemarkers.

So not only do you need to tee off from the correct box, you also need to tee off within the defined teeing area. So be careful when you tee up your ball. I see a lot of players that place their tee in front of the markers, so they have now played from the wrong tee box and need to also make the necessary corrections, same as if they played the wrong box.

And if you have not initially teed off from the correct tee box, here is the process to follow to make sure you finish with a correct score for the hole and your round.

- 1. Match Play. There is no penalty, but the opponent may cancel the stroke:
 - This must be done promptly and before either player makes another stroke.
 When the opponent cancels the stroke, they cannot withdraw the cancellation.
 - If the opponent cancels the stroke, the player must play a ball from inside the teeing area and it is still their turn to play.
 - If the opponent does not cancel the stroke, the stroke counts and the ball is in play and must be played as it lies.

2. **Stroke Play**. The player gets the general penalty (two penalty strokes) and must correct the mistake by playing a ball from inside the teeing area:

- The ball played from outside the teeing area is not in play.
- That stroke and any more strokes before the mistake is corrected (including strokes made and any penalty strokes solely from playing that ball) do not count.
- If the player does not correct the mistake before making a stroke to begin another hole or, for the final hole of the round, before returning their scorecard, the player is disqualified.

Definition of a Stroke

A <u>Stroke</u> is defined as the forward movement of the club made to strike the ball.

But a stroke has not been made if the player:

- Decides during the downswing not to strike the ball and avoids doing so by deliberately stopping the clubhead before it reaches the ball or, if unable to stop, by deliberately missing the ball.
- Accidentally strikes the ball when making a practice swing or while preparing to make a stroke.

When the Rules refer to "playing a ball," it means the same as making a stroke.

In my round at Prairie Isle one of our newer members did not realize that he needed to count his strokes even though he did not advance his ball in the high rough. So, any time you intend to hit the ball, it counts as a stroke and must be counted in your score.
